



ENVIRONMENTAL COOPERATION IRAN

Iran is facing **multiple environmental challenges** that affect its development prospects. The country therefore seeks to harmonise economic growth with the sustainable use of its natural resources. A **joint programme by eight leading European institutions** as well as **Iranian authorities and experts** aims at enhancing self-reliance in addressing challenges related to water resource management, air quality, waste management, and the marine environment in Iran.



THE GOALS



- Sound use of surface and groundwater resources: improving the management of river basins. Pilot project: Tashk Bakhtegan basin
- Higher air quality standards and measurement in cities: enhancing the monitoring and controlling of air quality. Pilots in Ahvaz and Tehran
- Enhanced waste management: improving services and practices. Pilot in Ahvaz
- Intensified marine environmental monitoring: strengthening capacities for safeguarding marine and coastal ecosystems

THE TOOLS



- Organising expert exchanges through study tours, training sessions, workshops and conferences
- Sharing Iranian, EU and international best practices
- Developing **joint assessments**, road maps and action plans
- Reviewing policies and legislative frameworks
- **Piloting participatory approaches** for integrated river basin management
- Enhancing environmental data and information management
